Sometimes we need a mental or emotional boost when we work for peace and justice. Ours comes from reading grant reports where our grantees share their accomplishments and successes. It's not the numbers and metrics that interest us, it's the stories. One of our favorites in 2007 comes from Sally Marr and Peter Dudar, two award-winning sculptors turned filmmakers, who spend their days screening their film *Arlington West*, about the emotional and physical toll of war, to high school students throughout California. The film provides the centerpiece of their Informed Enlistment Program that speaks to the same young people that the military recruiters target. Their stories of students debating recruiters and deciding against enlistment can't help but inspire us all to stand up for peace.

We hope that reading this annual report will provide you with the same hope and inspiration.

You will also see that 2007 marks the fourth year in a row that The Agape Foundation awarded grants exceeding \$1.1 million. More

than 75 grassroots organizations received funding to build a more just and peaceful world.

As the nation faced issues of war, environmental damage and human rights abuses, Agape responded by funding organizations that: provided students in Los Angeles with economic alternatives to joining the military; advocated for more effective groundwater protection in the San Joaquin Valley; trained immigrants about their rights in San Francisco's Tenderloin neighborhood; and developed white anti-racist leaders in the Bay Area.

Since 1969, Agape has been funding grassroots social change organizations. And we often fund them first, before more traditional institutions and foundations invest in their work.

Awarding grants for nonviolent social change isn't all that we do. In 2007, the Foundation accepted 13 new groups into its Fiscal Sponsorship Program. These California-based, grassroots peace and justice groups can now raise charitable gifts to: educate, mobilize

and organize Bay Area youth to resist aggressive military recruitment; encourage participatory democracy in Salinas; and improve the quality of legal representation for individuals facing the death penalty. These are just a few examples of the issues that our more than 80 fiscal sponsorship groups tackle daily.

Agape also commemorated the UN-declared International Day of Peace by holding its third annual Peace Prize event in San Francisco. On September 20th, Agape once again honored two Northern California peace-makers, H.O.M.E.Y. and Pablo Paredes, who represented the best and the brightest agents for change.

All of our work funding and supporting grassroots peace and justice organizations succeeds because of the generosity of our donors, the many volunteer hours given by our Board of Trustees, the dedication of our consultants and the hard work of our staff of three part-time employees. The Agape Foundation is truly powered by the people.

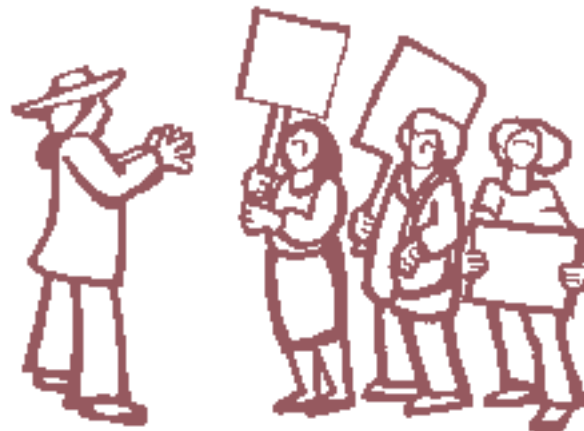
